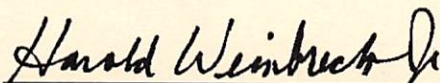

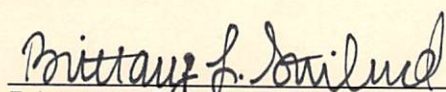

PROCLAMATION

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

WHEREAS the President of the United States has the honor to receive from the Secretary of the Interior a report of the Commissioner of the General Land Office, dated the 10th day of June, 1892, in which it is stated that certain lands in the State of California, which were reserved for the use of the Indians, have been found to be of no value for that purpose, and that the same may be sold for the benefit of the United States.

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IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and the seal of the United States at Washington, this 10th day of June, 1892.
